Hi, everyone! (Hold up Bible.) Today's story is from the very first book in the Bible, Genesis. "In Genesis, we read how God created this amazing world and everything in it. But people turned away from God and chose to go their own way. Still, God had a good plan to make things right. God chose a man named Abraham and promised to bless the whole world through his family. This didn't happen right away, though. Abraham and his wife Sarah had to wait. After years and years of waiting, they had a son named Isaac. When Isaac grew up, he and his wife Rebekah also had to wait a long time for a family. After what seemed like forever, they finally had twin boys: Jacob and Esau.
