



Your Role As a Small Group Leader

Be Prepared

Talk about the theme for each day, the week's verse, ask questions about the Bible story. Learn the kids names, connect with your kids, have games to play and affirm your kids. Carry your provided backpack with supplies needed for each day of camp.

Give Kids Expectations and Boundaries

Remind kids of the expectations of kids at Flatirons Community Church: to be respectful, kind, focused, and accountable. Affirm your kids for positive actions, and redirect misbehavior.

Have Fun!

Enjoy your group and have a great week with them! Fill the transition time with games, conversations, and things that build community. Do fun things to bring identity and FUN to your group

Build Relationships With Your Group

Please plan to wear modest clothes (nothing revealing). Pray for and with your kids, know and encourage your kids, and learn and discuss the Bible's bottom lines and stories together.
