God View

We wrap up the month in Romans 12:2. Paul was writing a letter to the Romans in which he encouraged them to “let [their] way of thinking be completely changed.” Paul wanted to remind the believers that God could continually change the way they thought, which would allow them to focus on God’s plan. When we spend time talking to God, learning from Scripture, and listening to others who follow God, we’ll be able to figure out what God wants to do in our lives.

Never stop growing in wisdom. Wisdom isn’t something that we find one time and then we’re done. It’s a continuous learning process that we’ll encounter for the rest of our lives. As we gain knowledge, we should want to gain God’s wisdom too. It’s not enough just to know something. We have to do something with what we know in order for it to make a difference.

WEEKLY COLLECTION CARDS

Your families are learning about their place in God’s family all month long in the auditorium. We will also be learning about that here in our rooms. We all have things we spend time doing—going to school, sports, or just hanging out. But God made us for more than that. When we follow him, he teaches us to become more and more like Jesus every day.

WK 4: Freedom— I am free. Christ died for me.

To help us remember the things we learn each week, we have these awesome trading cards for you to collect! They will remind us of who God made us to be. But here’s the deal. **You can only collect them if you are here at church.** So we want you to be here every week so that you can collect all 5!

INTRO 1 minute

(Hold up Bible.) Today we’re looking in the book of Romans to find an important way that we can grow in wisdom.

The book of Romans was originally a letter written by the apostle Paul to the believers in Rome. The interesting thing is that Paul wasn’t always a Jesus-follower. In fact, at first Paul

tried to STOP people from putting their faith in Jesus. But one day, Paul saw a blinding light and heard the voice of Jesus—and everything changed!

Paul began to follow Jesus, and he started new churches in lots of different places. Paul wrote letters to these churches and other believers to help them understand who Jesus is and how He wants us to live. Let's check out this week's Bible lesson.

Paul wanted the people in Rome to understand that we need to keep our focus on God in order to find wisdom. It's not something that happens just one time. It's a part of our lives as followers of Jesus to **[Bottom Line] Never stop growing in wisdom.**

We need to keep praying and asking God for wisdom. We need to read the Bible and notice the things that matter most to God. We need to spend time with wise friends who God has put in our lives. Then we won't get distracted by things that might SEEM important . . . but really AREN'T important at all. What matters most is our relationship with God and learning how to show God's love in the way we live each day.

Memory Verse

Show Verse: 1 John 3:1

When we put our faith in Jesus, we become part of God's family and He sends the Holy Spirit to live inside us. God's Spirit can help us and guide us as we follow Jesus with the way we live each day. There are things we can do to make sure we're focusing on God and continuing to change our way of thinking. We can make sure we're putting good things into our hearts and minds—by memorizing Bible verses, talking to God in prayer, and choosing to watch and listen to things that remind us about God.

Let's practice our Memory Verse, 1 John 3:1. Your family is also learning this verse in the auditorium all month long. This month, we will learn some motions too to help us remember the verse. Stand up and do what I do.

See *(make hands into circles and look through like binoculars)*

What great love the Father *(circle arms wide and give yourself a hug)*

Has lavished on us (wiggle fingers high and bring low)

That we should be called point to chest with thumbs)

Children (pretend to rock a baby in your arm)

Of God (point up with both index fingers)

1 John 3:1 (open hands like a book.)

PRAYER

Let's pray together! Dear God, thank You for this wise idea that we find in Paul's letter to the believers in Rome. Thank You for changing our minds and showing us what to do when we put our focus on You. Please give us the courage to follow You each day. Help us to grow in wisdom as we trust You. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.

Let's head to Small Group to talk some more about how we can keep growing in wisdom.
(Dismiss kids to their small groups).
