Week 3

God View

For week 3, we head to 2 Chronicles 10. King Solomon's son, Rehoboam, was now king, and the people came to ask him to lighten their workload. However, when presented with the opportunity to gain the people's trust, King Rehoboam sought out wise counsel . . . and unwise counsel. Unfortunately, Rehoboam chose to listen to his unwise friends, which led to catastrophic consequences for him and for God's people.

Hang out with wise people. There's a famous saying: "Show me your friends and I'll show you your future." The people we allow into our lives have the power to influence us, both positively and negatively. That doesn't mean we should cast people off and ignore them, but it does mean that we need to be aware of who we let speak into our lives and our situation. If we spend time with wise people, then we know it'll be worth it in the end.

WEEKLY COLLECTION CARDS

Your families are learning about their place in God's family all month long in the auditorium. We arel also be learning about that here in our rooms. We all have things we spend time doing—going to school, sports, or just hanging out. But God made us for more than that. When we follow him, he teaches us to become more and more like Jesus every day.

WK 3: Belonging—I am family. God invites everyone.

To help us remember the things we learn each week, we have these awesome trading cards for you to collect! They will remind us of who God made us to be. But here's the deal. You can only collect them if you are here at church. So we want you to be here every week so that you can collect all 5!

INTRO 1 minute

I've got a story to share with you from the Bible (hold up Bible) about someone who DIDN'T make the wise choice. This story shows us something important about wisdom that we can put into practice today.

Today our story comes from 2 Chronicles, which is a part of the Old Testament that tells the history of God's people. Early on in the Bible, we see how God planned to bless the world through the family of a man named Abraham. Over time, Abraham's family became known as the Israelites. During this part of the Israelites' history, the people asked God to give them a king who would lead them. The first king, Saul, didn't follow God. But King David ruled wisely over God's people. David's son, Solomon, later became king.

When Solomon was a young man, he asked God for wisdom so that he could lead the people well. Sure enough, God made Solomon one of the wisest people who ever lived! In fact, many of Solomon's wise sayings are collected in the book of Proverbs. (Hold up Bible.) Unfortunately, Solomon turned away from God later in his life . . . and he didn't pass on his wisdom to his son Rehoboam, who became the next king over God's people.

God has put wise people in our lives who can give us good advice and help us make wise choices. [Bottom Line] "Hang out with wise people. They can help us become more like Jesus in everything we do.

King Rehoboam chose to listen to the foolish words of his friends rather than the wise words of the elders. And that led to disaster! The Israelites ended up splitting into two groups: Israel and Judah. And the people continued to stray farther and farther from God.

But I'm glad that we can learn from our mistakes—or in this case, Rehoboam's mistake. It's really important that we spend time with people who follow God and make wise choices... because that will help us grow in wisdom.

Show Verse: 1 John 3:1

If you're in a situation where you're stuck and not sure what to do, you can talk to your parents or other wise adults and ask for help. It's also important to think about the friends and classmates who you spend most of your time with. Are they people who make wise choices and who follow God? It's important to be friendly and kind to everyone, but you want to spend the MOST time with people who you know will lead you toward wise choices.

God is a good father, and we are his children. He wants the very best for us and give us wise people because he loves us He loves us.

Let's read our Memory Verse, 1 John 3:1. Your family is also learning this verse in the auditorium all month long.

"See what great love the Father has lavished in us that we should be called children of God." 1 John 3:1

PRAYER

Let's pray and ask God to help us learn wisdom from the people around us.

Dear God, thank You for reminding us through this story that we need to spend time with wise people. Help us to learn from the mistakes King Rehoboam made. Give us the wisdom to listen to good advice from the people around us. Please guide us toward people who love You, follow You, and who can lead us toward Your wisdom. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.
