OPENER 3 minutes

(Welcome kids)

Hey, everyone! I'm thrilled that you're joining us here at Flatirons Kids!

We are just starting a brand-new month discovering all about the origins of our faith through the beginning of the Bible. When we decide to follow Jesus, our faith journey begins. Our theme this month is "Origin Story", so all month long we're going through our own version of superhero training!

GAME TIME

Superheroes have to be really strong, so today, we're doing strength training. Every stand up and make sure you have space to do our superhero workout! I'll call out a training challenge move and you do what I do! Ready? Let's play!

*Lead kids through training moves. ** OPTION: play Super Friend Training Video***

Show Game Slide: Superhero Trainer

 **Training Challenges (Call and Do):**

1. **"Fly like a hero!"** – Run in place with arms out
2. **"Laser dodge!"** – Duck left, duck right, jump up!
3. **"Scale the building!"** – Pretend to climb a tall wall
4. **"Invisible shield!"** – Hold out hands and duck behind it
5. **"Super stomp!"** – Big stomps to shake the villain's hideout
6. **"Rescue pose!"** – Freeze in a strong superhero stance!
7. **"Sneak past the bad guys!"** – Tiptoe in slow motion
8. **"Throw the power ring!"** – Pretend to toss it with a big yell
9. **"Freeze ray!"** – Yell "FREEZE!" and everyone freezes
10. **"Victory jump!"** – Big jumps with hands up shouting "We did it!"

You've passed superhero training! Now you're official heroes! Great job! Let's get ready to worship!

WORSHIP

One of the ways we worship is by giving praise and honor to God by singing and dancing. Now, is your time to jump in and give all you've got as we worship! You can follow along to the moves or worship in your own way. Let's sing!

INTRO

Show Series Graphic: Origin Story

We're doing something really cool this school year. We're going through the entire Bible to learn more about God. We're in the book of Genesis at the very beginning of the Bible. (Hold up Bible) In today's true story we'll look at a man named Noah, who was facing something he didn't understand.

Last week, we learned that in the beginning of Genesis, God created the whole world and everything in it . . . including people! Sin is anything that goes against God's way-and people kept choosing their own way instead of God's way. Noah was a godly man. Let's hear what the Bible says about Noah!

APPLICATION

Wow! Through many long years of building the ark and through the epic flood, Noah chose to trust, even when he didn't understand God's plan. And God kept His promise to Noah and kept him and his family safe through the flood.

Show Graphic: WK2_Bottom Line

Here's what we need to remember today: **[BOTTOM LINE] You can trust God even when you don't understand.**

Say that with me! *(Repeat with leaders and kids)*

After more than a year in the ark, it must have been such a huge relief for Noah and his family to get out into fresh air on the dry ground again. When God told Noah to build an ark, Noah chose to trust and obey, even though he didn't understand the big picture. Noah trusted that God would do what He said He would, and God did! God protected Noah, just like He promised. God is faithful, so we can have faith.

Show Graphic: Virtue

Faith means trusting in what you can't see because of what you can see.

When we face hard things that we don't understand, like Noah did, we can trust Him. We can trust that God is at work and He is with us. We have story after story after story in the Bible—God has never broken a promise. This is what the Bible has to say about it.

Show Verse: Hebrews 11:1 (NirV)

Let's say it together! *(Repeat with leaders and kids)*

God is worthy to be trusted, even when we face hard things and don't understand what is happening. All we have to do is ask for help. Let's do that now and pray.

PRAYER

Dear God, thank You so much for the way You were faithful in the story of Noah. Help us know how to trust You even when we don't understand what is happening. Thank You for Your plan to send Jesus for us. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.
