Bible Story: The Kings | *1 & 2 Kings*

Bottom Line: *Be wise because your choices matter*

Memory Verse: *“It is much better to get wisdom than gold. It is much better to choose understanding than silver.”- Proverbs 16:16 (NIRV)*

Insight: *God’s Message – What Jesus said and did impacts how I should respond to God’s Word in my everyday life*

Application: *Wisdom – Finding out God’s best and doing it*

Series Overview: This month’s theme —“Wisdomland: God can help you make the wise choice”—is inspired by all the ups and downs of a theme park roller coaster. The kings of Israel and Judah brought the nation to its pinnacle when they wisely chose to worship and honor God. And they led the nation down some stomach-dropping dips and ultimate derailment through their foolish decisions. Kids will discover that even though they may not be leading a nation, their choices matter deeply in their lives and the lives of the people around them.

Connection Centers

Connect: a time that invites kids to share with others and leaders

What You Need: Activity Bins + Coloring Sheets (find on your shelves in space)

What You Do:

- *PRE-CONNECTION TIME*
 - **Before kids arrive, pray for your group before they arrive. Pray for kids who will visit your group for the first time. Thank God for reminding you that even kids make choices that matter. Ask God to help your group see how their words, actions, and even their attitudes can lead them closer to You. Pray that your small group environment is a space where kids feel safe to learn, make mistakes, and grow in wisdom. Ask God to give you gentle words and creative ways to help them understand that being wise starts right now!**
- *DURING CONNECTION TIME*
 - Greet each child by name and with a high five or fist bump!
 - **Make sure to grab second sticker from the child + place it on your sticker sheet**
 - Invite kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
 - Pull out your activity bins + set aside some coloring sheets for kids to partake in your small group space
 - Ask questions in order to connect with + get to know your few as you partake in activities alongside them...you can use these :
 - ***“If you could have any superpower for just one day, what would it be and why?”***
 - ***“What's the best thing you did this summer? (Could be big or small!)”***

- *“What’s something super cool or interesting you know how to do? (Like tie your shoes, draw a great picture, or tell a funny joke!)”*
- *“If you could invent a new ice cream flavor, what would it be called and what would be in it?”*
- *AFTER CONNECTION TIME*
 - *Use this time to review over how to be successful in small group time as well as Flatirons Kids by using the SG Structure 101 sheet featured on your activity shelf*
 - Go over each rule to create a great small group experience
 - Transition into the Opening Small Group Activity

OPENING ACTIVITY

What You Need: “Ticket Toss” Activity Page; Prepared buckets; Floor tape

What You Do:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive with a high-five, fist bump, or a wave.
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Before you begin, place the “A” and “B” buckets at the front of your group area.
- Mark a line with tape on the opposite end of your group area.
- Give each kid six tickets from the “Ticket Toss” Activity Pages.
- Direct the kids to gather behind the tape line.
 - *They don’t have to stand in a line!*
- Explain that you will read a “Would You Rather” question, and each kid will travel to place their ticket into the “A” or “B” bucket to cast their vote.
- After each vote, give kids a moment to travel back to the other side of your group area.
- Ask a few kids to share why they made their choice.

- Repeat the process until all questions have been answered.
 - Would you rather: A) always win at rock-paper-scissors or, B) always win at hide-and-seek?
 - Would you rather: A) ride the world’s fastest roller coaster or, B) go down the world’s biggest water slide?
 - Would you rather: A) only have pizza forever or, B) only have ice cream forever?
 - Would you rather: A) be famous on YouTube or, B) be a world-famous athlete?
 - Would you rather: A) have unlimited slime or, B) have unlimited fidget toys?
 - Would you rather: A) never have to brush your teeth again or, B) never have to take a bath again?

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- Allow various movement variations like walking or hopping instead of running.
- If kids need more time to think before voting, give them time to do so.

What You Say:

“That was so fun! Those were some silly choices. But you know what? They reminded me of the choices we have to make every day. Sometimes our choices can feel small or big. And sometimes, our choices make a big impact on our lives and on others!

“Today, we’ll hear a true story from the Bible about different people who had to make important decisions, and what they chose shows us that choosing wisely matters. Let’s go!”

We’ll wrap up the month in First and Second Kings. Yes, you heard that right – we’re taking a high-level roller coaster ride through all the kings of Israel and

Judah! We'll land on a few kings, like Rehoboam and Ahab, who led the people far from God with their foolish choices. And we'll highlight several more, like Hezekiah and Josiah, who made wise choices, leading the people back to God.

CAUSE + EFFECT

[Live for God | Application Activity]

What You Need: “Cause + Effect” Activity Page; Writing Utensils

What You Do:

- Gather the kids together in a seated circle or at a table in your group area.
- Give every kid a “Cause and Effect” Activity Page and a pencil.
- Invite the kids to form groups of 2-3.
- Say, “We’re going to do an activity together to help us think about how our choices lead to different outcomes! On one side of your page, you’ll see **causes**, things someone might do (*point to them*). On the other side, you’ll see **effects**, what might happen next (*point to them*).”
- Instruct the kids to work together to draw lines from each cause to its possible effect.
- Refer to your copy of the “Cause and Effect” Activity Page, and, one by one, talk through each of their choices as a group!
- Ask, “Can you think of a time you made a wise choice and it led to something good?”
- Ask, “What are some ways we can practice listening to the Holy Spirit in everyday life? Like at school, with our friends, or at home?” (*Pausing before reacting, asking God for help in the moment, and reading the Bible to learn God’s voice.*)

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- If it works better for your group, allow them to act out the cause/effect scenes instead of matching them on the paper.

What You Say:

“Great thinking, friends! Our choices matter. They matter because they shape our lives and the lives of others. The choices we make can lead to all kinds of outcomes—some good, some not-so-great. That’s why today’s bottom line is SO important: **Be wise because your choices matter!**”

“Wisdom can mean stopping to ask: ‘Hmm. God, what might happen if I do this?’ He wants to help you make the wise choice! When we choose to follow Jesus, God’s Son, we aren’t on our own to figure things out—we have the Holy Spirit to guide us! The Holy Spirit helps us stop, think, and make decisions that honor God.

“What are some of these wise, godly choices we can make? Well, we can look at the life of Jesus to know what’s wise! He is God and He showed us how God would live. Jesus didn’t just tell people what was right. He lived it! He was kind. He was honest. He was fair. He was forgiving. He listened. He helped people who needed help.

“As we try to live wisely, we won’t be perfect, but we’ll grow in God’s wisdom as we keep asking for it and practicing, even when it’s hard. This week before you react, pause and remind yourself to **be wise because your choices matter!**”

VERSE TOWER CHALLENGE

[Hear from God | Memory Verse Activity]

What You Need: “Cup Stack” Activity Page; Marker; Bibles; Floor Tape

What You Do:

- Before you begin, use floor tape to mark two starting lines on one end of your group space.
- Divide the kids into two teams and have them stand behind each line.

- Place a stack of 19 cups a few feet away (for the NIrV) from each starting line.
- Give each team one permanent marker, and one Bible.
- Direct the teams to look up Proverbs 16:16.
 - ***Finding verses for 2-3rd graders:** Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find the name of the book in the list. When they find the book, lead them to look at the page number beside it. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find that book. Help the kids find the page. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find the correct chapter. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find the correct verse in that chapter.*
- Repeat the verse together several times.
- Review any words in the verse that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
- Show the kids the “Cup Stack” Activity Page and say, “Are you ready for a verse relay? One at a time, you will each race to:
 - Grab one cup from the stack.
 - Bring it back to your group.
 - And use the marker to write one word from Proverbs 16:16 on it!
- Once the word is written, the next kid can go!”
- Say: “After your team has written all the words, you’ll work together to make a cup pyramid with the verse in order. When your team is done, shout, ‘PROVERBS 16:16!’”
- At your signal, begin the game!
- Once a team has collected all of their cups and written on them, give them a “Cup Stack” Activity Page to follow to build their pyramid.
- Play until both teams have stacked the verse words in correct order.

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- If it suits your group better, prepare two sets of cups with the words from Proverbs 16:16 on them.

What You Say:

“That was so fun! It took some focus to place those cups in just the right order. It also takes focus to build our lives on God’s wisdom too.

“I love that we can trust the Bible because it’s God’s true Word. The King of all gave it to us. Every word helps us know who God is, how much He loves us, and how we can live in a way that honors Him!

“The truth is that wisdom starts in our hearts. When we want what God wants, that’s when we realize we don’t have all the answers. And that’s when wisdom begins to grow in us. God’s wisdom is so very precious! So let’s all keep asking God for wisdom and letting His truth shape how we live. Remember, **be wise because your choices matter!**”

PRAYER TIME

[Pray to God | Prayer Activity]

What You Need: Index cards; writing utensils

What You Do:

- Gather the kids in a circle.
- Give every kid an index card and a pencil.
- Invite the kids to think about a time they might need wisdom this week.
 - *While playing on the playground with friends.*
 - *During a sports game.*
 - *Responding to a parent.*
 - *Making the right choices during class.*
 - *Looking out for others in need.*

- Direct them to write or draw about it on their index card.
- Invite them to pray silently to God, asking for His wisdom to flood their minds as they make choices this week so they can grow strong and beautiful lives!
- Close the group in prayer.

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- If your group works better in pairs, invite them to partner up and pray for one another. You can give them a prompt like, “Pray for your friend to be wise at school this week.”

What You Say:

“Dear God, thank You for showing us how important our choices are. Thank You for Jesus, who not only showed us how to live wisely, but also gave us a way to be close to You! We want to live like Him! Please fill our hearts with Your wisdom. Remind us to read Your Word, and surround ourselves with others who follow Your Son, Jesus. We love You, God, and we pray these things in Jesus’ name. Amen.”

[As grown-ups arrive to pick up, encourage the kids to tell their grown-ups what they learned from the true story of the kings: be wise because your choices matter!]
