Bible Story: *Elijah + Prophets of Baal | 1 Kings 18:16-45*

Bottom Line: *God can do the impossible*

Memory Verse: *“Those who trust in the Lord will receive new strength. They will fly as high as eagles. They will run and not get tired. They will walk and not grow weak.”- Isaiah 40:31 (NirV)*

Insight: *Identity Based on God’s Image – I am created in the image of God and have unique potential and worth*

Application: *Confidence – Living like you believe God is with you*

Series Overview: God chose a people and promised through them to bless the whole world. And God fulfilled that promise by sending Jesus to rescue and redeem us. When we begin to understand this story and allow it to inform everything in our lives, we can live from a place of quiet confidence, knowing God is always with us and is able to work every single thing we face into a beautiful pattern for our good. This month, we’re exploring some larger-than-life characters from God’s story who lived during the decline of Israel and Judah and the following exile. These individuals chose to—or failed to—place the full weight of their lives on trust in God. Through stories of Elijah, Jonah, Daniel, Esther, and Nehemiah we see how making choices from a foundation of trust changes everything about the way you live

Connection Centers

Connect: a time that invites kids to share with others and leaders

What You Need: Activity Bins + Coloring Sheets (find on your shelves in space)

What You Do:

- *PRE-CONNECTION TIME*
 - **Before kids arrive, pray for your group before they arrive. Pray for kids who will visit your group for the first time! Thank God that you have built your confidence on Him and not on yourself or others. Recall an age-appropriate story about a time when you trusted God even when things looked impossible. Thank God for always showing up! Ask God to help every kid learn how to live knowing He is with them, so they enter every situation with confidence in Him. Pray that even if a kid feels like the only one following God (like Elijah), they would know they're not alone, because the Holy Spirit is with them.**
- *DURING CONNECTION TIME*
 - Greet each child by name and with a high five or fist bump!
 - **Make sure to grab second sticker from the child + place it on your sticker sheet**
 - Invite kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
 - Pull out your activity bins + set aside some coloring sheets for kids to partake in your small group space
 - Ask questions in order to connect with + get to know your few as you partake in activities alongside them...you can use these :
 - ***What is one thing you are good at that you are thankful God gave you? (Like drawing, running fast, or making people laugh.)***

- *What's an everyday thing that most people forget to be thankful for, but you are thankful for it? (Like shoes, pencils, or clean water.)*
- *What is your favorite memory you've made with your family this fall?*
- *Would you rather have a giant pile of marshmallows or a giant pile of apples?*
- *If you could trade places with any character from a book for a day, who would it be?*
- *AFTER CONNECTION TIME*
 - *Use this time to review over how to be successful in small group time as well as Flatirons Kids by using the SG Structure 101 sheet featured on your activity shelf*
 - Go over each rule to create a great small group experience
 - Transition into the Opening Small Group Activity

9:05 - 9:20 | 11:05 – 11:20 | OPENING SMALL GROUP

OPENING ACTIVITY

What You Need: “Possibility Cards” Activity Page; Inflated balloon or beach ball; blocks; plastic spoons

What You Do:

- Greet each kid by name with a fist bump, high-five, smile, or wave as they arrive!
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Gather the kids in a circle.
- Set the stack of “Possibility Cards” in the center.
- Say: “Our group will take turns pulling a card from the stack. You will read your card aloud to the group, and we’ll decide together:
 - Is this impossible for you?

- Could you or someone else do it?
- Could God do it?
- If it's hard but possible, invite the kids to try it out using the supplies.
 - *For example, if a kid pulls a card that says, "Stack seven blocks, only using your elbows!" Let them use the blocks to give it a try.*
- Play until all the scenario cards have been read

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- Offer roles besides doing the challenge for kids who may be shy or have physical limitations. Let them read the cards, hand out blocks, or gather supplies!
- If you need to adjust the movement to your group's needs, feel free to perform only the challenges that everyone can do. Simply discuss the others as a group!

What You Say:

“Whoa, some of those cards were really silly. Some of them felt absolutely impossible. Did anyone try one that felt hard, but you tried it anyway?”

“In today’s true story from the Bible, we’ll hear about a man named Elijah. He faced a challenge way bigger than stacking blocks or holding a balloon between your knees. But he trusted God to do something completely impossible. Let’s discover what happened when Elijah showed big confidence in our BIG God!”

9:20 - 9:50 | 11:20 – 11:50 | LARGE GROUP

We start off with Elijah on Mount Carmel. King Ahab had led the people far from God—and for three years, the land had received no rain. But Elijah was so confident in God that he challenged 450 prophets of Baal to a duel-by-fire-from-heaven. These prophets placed their confidence in a false god. But when Elijah called out to the one true God, the answer was explosive!

9:50 – 10:10 | 11:50 – 12:10 | SMALL GROUP

BUILT TO STAND

[Live for God | Application Activity]

What You Need: “Trust Test” Activity Pages; soft item (pillow or folded blanket); firm item (carboard or sturdy book); blocks

What You Do:

- Set the two “foundations” down—the soft item and the firm item.
- Instruct the kids to form a circle around your two “foundations.”
- Keep the blocks nearby.
- Point to the soft item and ask: “What do you think will happen if we try to build a tall tower on this?”
 - *Most will say it will fall. Agree!*
- Point to the firm item and ask: “What do you think will happen if we try to build a tall tower on this?”
 - *Most will say it’ll stand strong. Agree!*
- Let the kids help you build two towers simultaneously, one on the soft foundation and one on the firm foundation, as you read the “Trust Test” Activity Page challenges.
- Say, “Each of the Trust Test Challenges describes a tough situation, something that might shake our confidence. As we build a tower on each base, we’ll see how trusting in ourselves can feel shaky, but when we trust in God, we’re built to stand!”
- Let the tower built on the soft foundation fall and wobble. Celebrate the tower with the firm foundation holding steady!
- Keep adding blocks until you’ve read all the challenges.
 - Is it easy or hard to have confidence in God in these circumstances?
 - What would happen if we only trusted ourselves?
 - How does trusting God make a difference, even when it’s hard?

- ***[Make It Personal] (Share an age-appropriate example of a time you felt like something was impossible, but you chose to put your confidence in God. Did it change how you responded to the situation? Did God give you the courage to try something new?)***

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- If the sound of blocks falling or stacking is too much, set the blocks aside and review the “Trust Test” challenges verbally instead.

What You Say:

“Elijah stood on the mountain in front of everyone, prayed to God, and said:

“Lord, you are the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel. Today let everyone know that you are God in Israel. ... Let them know I’ve done all these things because you commanded me. Answer me. Lord, answer me. Then these people will know that you are the one and only God. They’ll know that you are turning their hearts back to you again.” —1 Kings 18:36-37 (NirV)

“Elijah trusted God, *even when he was the only one!* He didn’t put his confidence in himself, or in being popular, or in being the loudest. He put His confidence in God—he knew God is strong, and God is powerful—and he faced all of those other prophets, trusting that God was going to do something amazing.

“We can have the same confidence in every situation we face. God is the strongest. There is nothing more powerful than Him. And when we choose to follow Jesus, He comes to live inside of us. We go through everything in our lives with the strongest!

“That tower we tried to make with the soft foundation is kind of like putting our confidence in things that aren’t steady. They fall, and they let us down. But trusting God? That is building your life on the firmest foundation, EVER!

“When you chose to follow Jesus, God sent the Holy Spirit to live in you, and you can ask Him to give you confidence to stand strong—even when something feels scary or impossible—because *God* is strong. In the moment, you can pray, ‘God,

help me remember that You are strong, and You are with me. Help me be confident in You right now.’ God faces everything with you! So you can put your confidence in God because **God can do the impossible.**”

MOVE AND REMEMBER

[Hear From God | Memory Verse Activity]

What You Need: Bibles; “Verse Motions” Activity Page

What You Do:

- Gather the kids together.
- Give every kid a Bible.
- Invite them to look up this month’s Memory Verse, Isaiah 40:31, using the Bible Navigation Tips.
 - ***Finding verses for 2-3rd graders:** Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find the name of the book in the list. When they find the book, lead them to look at the page number beside it. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find that book. Help the kids find the page. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find the correct chapter. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find the correct verse in that chapter.*
- Repeat the verse together several times.
- Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
- Use the “Verse Motions” Activity Page to teach the Memory Verse motions.
- Walk through the motions slowly, until the kids have learned them.
- Challenge the group to perform them:
 - Fast
 - Slow

- Without words

Inclusive Pro-Tips:

- Print a few extra “Verse Motions” Activity Pages to support visual learners and readers who want to follow along with their own copies of the motions.

What You Say:

“You learned those motions so quickly!

“Our Memory Verse this month, Isaiah 41:30, comes from the book of Isaiah. Isaiah was a prophet (which means he was a messenger from God). He shared God’s words. This is a message Isaiah shared with God’s people when the people were feeling a little weak and tired—maybe even a little hopeless! God’s people had been through a lot, and Isaiah reminded them that they didn’t have to try to be strong on their own.

“When we trust in God, God gives us strength! Not just the kind of strength to run and walk, but the confidence to keep going even when life gets hard. You can trust that the same God who helped His people back then is still helping us today! When you trust in Him, He will give you new strength! Keep practicing these motions at home and remember **God can do the impossible!**”

PRAYER TIME

[Pray to God | Prayer Activity]

What You Need: N/A

What You Do:

- Gather the kids in a circle.
- Invite every kid to think about something in their life that feels hard, scary, or impossible.
 - *Maybe your family is going through a big change.*
 - *Maybe you really want to pray out loud, but you feel nervous.*

- *Maybe you want to tell a friend about Jesus, but you're not sure how.*
- Remind them that Elijah had confidence because he trusted in God, not in himself. God is the strongest, and He goes with you in everything!
- Say: “As we pray, imagine giving that thing you're worried about to Jesus.”
- Close in prayer.

What You Say:

“God, thank You so much for all of my friends here today! Thank You for showing us that You can do the impossible through the story of Elijah and the prophets of Baal. Teach us how to live knowing and believing You are with us, and You are the strongest!

“God, if there are any friends here who are curious to know more about putting their faith in Your Son, Jesus, help them know how much You love them! Thank You for sending Jesus to save us and make a way for us to be close friends with You! Help us all take a step closer to You today, whether we're just starting or we've known You for a long time. We love You, God, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.”

[As adults arrive to pick up, encourage the kids to show off the Memory Verse motions to Isaiah 40:31. Challenge them to teach the verse and motions to their family or a friend this week!]
