

### Activity Name: Ring the Truth

#### What You Need:

- Cone with Bible cutout attached
- Ring toss rings
- Tape

#### What You Say:

Look at this bottle! There's a picture of the Bible on it! We're going to play a game to try and toss these rings around the Bible.

Come line up behind this tape line and we'll all take turns tossing the ring. That's the Bible! It teaches us the best things! Say that with me! That's the Bible! It teaches us the best things! Great job! Let's keep going! *(Continue with each child. Repeat as desired.)*

#### What You Do:

- Invite children to take turns trying to toss a ring around the Bible.
- After each successful toss, cheer and say, "That's the Bible! It teaches us the best things!"

#### What You Say:



#### Activity Name: Hear from God

#### What You Need:

- Ear cut outs
- Coloring tools
- Glue stick
- Tape or stapler

#### What You Say:

Today, we heard a story about one of Jesus' friends, named Philip. He helped someone know what God's words meant. Phillip loved God. Philip helped the man in the chariot understand God's words so he could hear from God. We can hear from God, too! We can hear from God when we read the Bible and look at the pictures, or when someone reads the Bible to us! The Bible teaches us how to do what God says and love like Jesus. The Bible has God's words in it, and it teaches us the BEST things! What does the Bible teach you? **[Bottom Line] The Bible teaches me the best things.**

Did you know that when we read or look at pictures in a Bible storybook, we are hearing from God? We are! I have a fun way for us to remember that we can listen to what God tells us. (*Hold up the ear a prepared headband.*) I've got these super fun ears for us to make! Let's decorate them and make them into a headband we can wear home!

#### What You Do:

- Give each kid 1 ear cutout and 1 sentence strip.
- Help write each kids name on their sentence trip.
- Encourage children to decorate their sentence strip.
- Help children glue the top part of their ears to the strip, allowing it to hang down over the child's face.
- Measure each child's strip around their head and staple/tape the ends together.
