Hi, friends! Welcome to Flatirons Kids!! It's Move Up month! We have kids who are new to our room! I'm so glad you're here today. It's finally SUMMER and we are going to have an amazing time! You know what, before we go any further, I've got some VERY important questions. Raise your hand if this is you.

Let's go! This summer, our theme is '**Kingdom Quest**,' and the full name of our series is 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure.' We're going to discover some pretty amazing stories Jesus told that help us learn about God's kingdom. I'm so excited!

GAME TIME

To get us started, we're going to play a game

Alright everyone—it's time for ZOOMED-IN SUMMER MYSTERY! I'm about to show you some super close-up pictures of summer stuff. Your job is to figure out what it is before anyone else! Some are easy... some are going to make you say, 'WAIT... WHAT IS THAT?!'"

Get ready... shout it out when you think you know it!

Put one zoomed-in image on the screen. Give kids 5–10 seconds to shout guesses. Encourage funny wrong answers to build energy, then reveal the full image

When most of us hear the word 'kingdom,' we picture something huge and dramatic. Castles. Thrones. Knights. Maybe even a giant flag waving in the wind. But Jesus talked about God's kingdom in a way that made people stop and say, 'Wait, what?'

Have you ever had a moment when something *seemed* small, so small you barely noticed it, but later on, you realized it mattered more than you thought? Maybe someone said one encouraging sentence that changed your whole day. Or you made a tiny choice that ended up affecting a whole situation. Or maybe something started out ordinary but turned into something way bigger than you expected. Those moments don't feel very important at the time. But later, you realize that it actually mattered.

(HOLD UP BIBLE.) Today's true story from the Bible is in the book of Matthew. We're going to hear how Jesus explained God's kingdom in a really surprising way. He used stories, called parables, to show us something HUGE ... by starting with something incredibly small.

Today's Bible Story reminds us that God's kingdom may have started small, but it was going to grow big! A tiny seed becomes a massive tree. A little yeast transforms the entire dough. And it did!

That's what God's kingdom is like. We who follow Jesus are a part of something huge, and that's so exciting! Let's keep on pointing to the kingdom of God.

I'm so grateful Jesus came and taught us this about God's kingdom. There's so much we wouldn't know about God's kingdom unless Jesus told us! You see, Jesus is God, and He came from where God lives. While Jesus was on earth, He taught us about things of God. He came and taught us about God's kingdom.

That's exactly what our Bottom Line for this week says:

[Bottom Line] Jesus shows us God's kingdom.

Say that with me! **(Repeat with leaders and kids)**

Remember, the mustard seed didn't look like much. The yeast didn't look like much. And honestly? The start of the Church didn't look like much either. Just a small group of people following Jesus. But God took that small beginning ... and grew it into something massive. And that means something huge for you: If you follow Jesus, you are part of God's kingdom. Right now. Today. Your choices, your words, and your faith are part of what God uses to show His kingdom to the world.

You can point to God's kingdom through your actions. And don't overlook the small things. Don't assume your actions don't matter. Don't assume God isn't working because you can't see the whole picture yet. A lot of God's best work starts beneath the surface ... and then grows into something bigger than you imagined. And wow, is it amazing!

Our Memory Verse this month isn't just something to memorize; it's something to pray, something to trust, and something we can come back to all throughout our lives. It's something Jesus taught His followers, and we're going to hold on to it all month long. It's Matthew 6:10, and it says:

Hey, everyone! Welcome to Flatirons Kids! And welcome back to Kingdom Quest! I'm so glad you're here today. If today is your first time, or your first time in a while, you made it! We're pumped you're here, and we believe God is going to teach you something today.

We're spending the whole summer talking about God's kingdom. The full name of our series this month is 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure.' God is loving, joyful, kind, good, just, and honest—among other things. And God's kingdom is where He reigns, and where those characteristics are the way things operate! God's kingdom is a great, great place!

Today's Bible Story is one of the most powerful ones Jesus ever told. But before we get there, we've got a game to play.

GAME TIME

Let's play 'Would You Go Back?' I'm going to describe a few things you might lose, and you decide: Would you actually go back for it ... or would you just let it go?

If you WOULD go back, take 2 steps backward. If you think it's NOT worth it, stand still. But you have to pay attention- be sure not to knock over your friend in front of or behind you!

Got it? Alright! Here's the first one: Let's say you're leaving the house, and you forget your water bottle! But you're in a huge rush. Would you go back and get it?

(Pause as kids move.)

Okay, okay, some of you are deeply attached to your hydration, and some of you are like, 'I'll just be thirsty forever.'

Next one: You're in a rush again, but you forget your homework folder and need it for school. You probably don't want it, but you might need it. Would you go back to get it?

(Pause as kids move.)

Okay, one more. Your pet. Let's say you're moving, and you have packed everything up. But then, you realize your pet is still in the house! Would you go back?

(Pause as kids move.)

There it is. No hesitation. You're sprinting back for that one! Of course, you're going to get your pet! You all can take a seat! Here's the thing: Not everything is worth going back for. Some things are just ... things. But something special, or someone? That's different. And that's what makes today's Bible Story so powerful. Jesus is about to show us who He's willing to go back for.

That was fun! You all did great! You can go back to your seats now.

Today's Bible Story reminds us of something incredibly important about God and God's kingdom. The story of the lost sheep isn't just a cute story; it's a picture of who Jesus is.

God wants everyone to be close to Him and a part of His kingdom. But sin keeps us from being close to God. So, Jesus did what we needed to make a way for us to come back to God. He paid the price for our sin. Jesus paid the price to bring us back to God. We were all lost, but Jesus made a way for all of us to come back home to Him and be God's forever friend!

Every single person had the same need. Every single person had a sin problem. And Jesus paid for the sin of anyone who would choose to accept what He did on the cross. Jesus made a way for all of us to be a part of God's kingdom! And that's what our Bottom Line today is all about. Let's check it out!

[BOTTOM LINE] Jesus made a way for you to be part of God's kingdom.

Say that with me! **(Repeat with leaders and kids)**

When Jesus told this story, He wasn't talking about sheep and shepherds. He was talking about God, and He was talking about you.

You are the very loved sheep that Jesus went after, so you could come home to being His friend. You can't earn God's love, and you can't earn what He did for you. You can't earn what Jesus did by being good, and you can't pay God back. Just be the much-loved sheep.

Great job. And remember, this isn't just a verse to memorize. It's a prayer you can pray anywhere, anytime. God's kingdom, where He reigns, is amazing, amazing, amazing. God is good, and His kingdom is so good! And God wants His kingdom—His goodness, and His ways—to show up in your life and in the world around you. When we pray this verse, we're asking God to bring His kingdom more to our world.

Before we head to small groups, I want to leave you with one last question to think about.

Show Conversation Starter: WK2

What is the way to God's kingdom? In our Bible Story today, Jesus told a story that taught something shocking about God. The religious leaders thought the way into God's kingdom was by doing everything right. But Jesus showed them something completely different—God's kingdom is entered through Him. He is the way. He's the One who goes after the lost, rescues them, lifts them, and brings them home.

So as you head to Small Groups, think honestly about this question. Since Jesus is the One who makes the way into God's kingdom, what does that mean for you? What does it mean when you feel far away, confused, or unsure? Talk about it with your group. This is a space to ask real questions and discover what it looks like to follow the One who never stops coming after you.

Let's take a quiet moment to pray together.

PRAYER

Jesus, thank You for being the kind of King who comes after us. Thank You for making a way for us to be part of God's kingdom, not because we earned it, but because You love us. Help us to learn to live in Your love, and to offer it to everyone because You want everyone in Your kingdom! Thank You for being our Shepherd and King. We love You, God, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.

Welcome back to Kingdom Quest, everyone! I'm so glad you're here! We've been learning about God's kingdom all month long, and the full title of our series this month is 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure.'

So, what is God's kingdom? Well, God is good, kind, just, trustworthy, and patient—among other things! And His kingdom is anywhere where He reigns. The kingdom is where the ways of the King are the way things run! God wants to spread His good kingdom everywhere! And that's what we're going to learn about today in today's Bible Story.

Today's Bible Story shows us something huge about God. Whether someone runs away like the younger son or stands on the outside like the older son, our heavenly Father moves toward both of them. He doesn't wait for them to fix everything or earn their way back. He goes out to meet them because His heart is for people to come home. That's who God is—a Father who welcomes, restores, and celebrates.

And that's what our Bottom Line today is all about. Let's take a look!

Show Graphic: WK 3_Bottom Line

[BOTTOM LINE] God wants everyone to be part of His kingdom.

Say that with me! (Repeat with leaders and kids)

He's not satisfied with empty chairs at the table. He wants the chairs filled. And He'll make room when it's full! Not just for the people who look like they have it all together. Not just for the people who haven't messed up recently. Not just for the people who grew up in church. Everyone.

That's why Jesus told this story. Because God doesn't wait for us to find our way home—He comes toward us. So whether you feel like the younger son or the older son today, the invitation is the same: Come to the table. Everyone belongs in God's kingdom.

Our Memory Verse this month is a prayer Jesus gave to his followers. He wasn't just teaching people what to say—He was teaching them what God's heart is like. He wanted them to understand that God's kingdom isn't distant or exclusive. It's something God wants to bring into our world, our lives, and the places where we feel lost or unsure. It's Matthew 6:10, and it says:

Great job, friends! When we pray this verse, we're asking God to help us live His way so that our homes, our classrooms, our playgrounds, and our whole world start to look more like His kingdom.

Before we head to small groups, I want to leave you with one last question to think about.

Show Conversation Starter: WK3

When have you discovered something new about God? In the story Jesus told, there were two sons who couldn't have been more different. One ran away and made a huge mess. The other stayed close but still didn't understand his father's heart. And yet the father went out to *both* of them. He didn't wait for perfect behavior. He didn't wait for the right words. He didn't wait for them to earn anything. He simply invited them home.

A lot of us grow up thinking we have to check certain boxes or achieve certain things before God will want us. But Jesus' story pushes us to rethink that. It raises a real, honest question: What actually makes someone part of God's kingdom? Is it being good enough? Is it getting everything right? Is it never messing up? Or ... is it something else entirely?

The reality is, God comes to us. Will we receive His grace and love? Because if we do, He will change us from the inside out. As you go to Small Groups, talk about it. Share what you really think. Listen to each other. Ask questions. This is the kind of conversation where God can show you something new. Let's pray.

PRAYER

God, thank You for showing us what Your heart is really like. Thank You for being the kind of Savior who runs toward us when we're far away and invites us close when we feel like we don't belong. Thank You for making a way for us to be part of God's kingdom, not because we earned it, but because You love us. Help us trust that there is always a place for us at Your table. Help us see others the way You do. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.

WELCOME

Hi everyone! Welcome to Flatirons Kids! I'm so excited to see you here today!

Show Series Graphic: KingdomQuest

Welcome back, everybody! This month, we've been talking all about God's kingdom! The full title of our series this month is 'Kingdom Quest—Seeking the Greatest Treasure'.

What is God's kingdom? God is loving, joyful, peaceful, kind, trustworthy, and patient. His kingdom is a place where those things fill everything and everyone. The kingdom is like the King! And God wants His kingdom to spread everywhere.

All summer long we are learning about God and his kingdom---but before we jump into worship and our Bible lesson, let's have some fun with a game.

GAME TIME

Today we're playing a favorite. It's called 'Head, Shoulders, Knees, Cup!'

SLIDE: Head, Shoulders, Knees, Cup! Title

I need players who think they have lightning-fast hands. First....find a partner, then we'll give each pair a cup.

(Have kids pair up. Place one cup on the floor in between each pair.)

Here's how this works: You'll face your partner with the cup between you. When I say, 'Head,' touch your head. 'Shoulders,' touch your shoulders. 'Knees,' touch your knees. But when you hear me say, "Cup," you grab the cup. The first one to grab it moves on to the next round, and we'll play until there's only one pair left. The person who wins that round is the champion!

Oh, and by the way, if you grab the cup early? You're out.

Sound good? Ready to play?

Okay players, hands down at your sides ... here we go.

Head ... Shoulders ... Knees ... Head ... Knees ... Head ... Shoulders ... CUP!

(The winners of that round move on to the next round and pair up with someone new; the losers of that round take their seats. Repeat rounds until two finalists remain.)

Alright, championship round! You two have made it all the way here.

Hands down ... ready?

Head ... Knees ... Shoulders ... Head ... Knees ... Shoulders ... CUP!

(Declare the winner.)

Make some noise for our Cup Champion! And let's give it up for all our players!

Let's jump into worship!

It grabs your attention instantly. It becomes the most important thing in the room.

(HOLD UP BIBLE.) Today we are in the book of Matthew. We're going to look at two stories Jesus told about people who discovered something just like that. Something so surprising and so valuable that everything else shifted the moment they saw it. Let's check out our video!

Today's parables remind us that when people really saw the value of God's kingdom, everything else shifted. Not because the other things weren't good, but because they finally understood what mattered most. The man who found the treasure, the merchant who found the pearl, and even the disciples who dropped their nets all had the same moment: They saw something so good and so valuable that following God became the clear choice.

Our Bottom Line today helps remind us what's most important. Let's take a look.

***[BOTTOM LINE]* Loving God and His kingdom is most important.**

Say that with me! **(Repeat with leaders and kids)**

In both stories, the moment the treasure was discovered, everything made sense. The decision wasn't forced. It wasn't stressful. It was joyful. Because when you discover something truly valuable, it becomes clear what matters most. And that's exactly what Jesus wanted the crowd to understand about God's kingdom. God's kingdom isn't something you add to your already full list. It becomes the center—the thing that helps everything else fall into its right place.

Just like the disciples—they weren't running away from their jobs or their families. They weren't trying to escape their lives. They simply saw something in Jesus that was worth more. Something worth following. Their decision wasn't about losing something; it was about gaining something far greater.

Let's take a look at this month's Memory Verse. Jesus taught these exact words because He wanted His followers, including us, to understand what it looks like to want God's ways. We can pray bold prayers asking for God's kingdom to come down to where we are.

It's Matthew 6:10, and it says:

Show Verse: Matthew 6:10 NIrV

**‘May your kingdom come. May what you want to happen be done on earth as it is done in heaven.
Matthew 6:10 Nlrv Nlrv.’**

Let’s say it together! (Repeat with leaders and kids)

When you begin to understand how good God is and how incredible His kingdom is, it changes the way you see everything else. Not because those things stop mattering ... but because you’ve seen something that matters most. The treasure. The pearl. The kingdom and the oh-so-good God who reigns over it.

Before we head to small groups, I want to leave you with one last question to think about.

Show Conversation Starter: WK4

What is most important? Today, we looked at two stories Jesus told—stories where people discovered something so valuable that it changed the way they saw everything else. The treasure in the field. The pearl worth more than every other pearl. And even the disciples dropping their nets the moment Jesus called them. None of those people were forced to make a choice. They simply recognized something better.

A lot of the time, our lives feel full of things that matter to us—our friendships, our hobbies, our goals, the things we enjoy. And those things *do* matter. But Jesus’ stories invite us to step back and ask a big question: What actually comes first in my life? What is the thing that matters most? Not the automatic answer ... the honest one.

As you head into Small Groups, talk about it. Think about the things that feel important to you, the things you chase, the things that hold your attention. And be open to the idea that Jesus might be showing you something even better—something worth building your whole life around.

Let’s take a quiet moment to pray together.

PRAYER

Jesus, thank You for showing us what matters most. Thank You for the stories You told and for the way You help us understand God’s kingdom. Sometimes, we get distracted by a lot of good things in our lives, but help us see Your goodness even more clearly. Help us want what You want. Help us love what You love. Jesus, thank You for inviting us to follow You, just like You invited the disciples. We want to put You first in the everyday moments of our week. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus’ name. Amen.
