Activity Name: God Sees Me

What You Need: ☐ Noneneeded

What You Say:

Hello, my wonderful friends! We learned in our Bible Story that God sees everything we do, all day long. Let's play a movement game to show all the things God sees!

Just listen and do what I do! Ready? God knows when you ... STAND UP! (Stand up tall.) Good standing!

God knows when you ... SIT DOWN! (Sit on the floor.) Good sitting!

God knows when you ... RUN AND PLAY! (Run in place and wiggle.) Yay, playing!

God knows when you ... SLEEP! (Lie down and pretend to sleep.) Shhh ... snore, snore. WAKE UP, little sleepers!

Let's do it again! (Repeat as time and interest allow.) God knows when you STAND UP! God knows when you SIT DOWN!

Transition: Good job, friends! In today's true story from the Bible, we are going to learn that God sees and knows everything, even us, because we are so important to Him. Let's go hear our story.

Lead your group to the Large Group area.

MEMORY VERSE: Open the Bible with action card inside. Say the verse and demonstrate the motions for the children.

Let's learn our brand-new Memory Verse. It tells us how God made us, and it goes like this: 'How you *(point up)* made me *(point to self)* is amazing and wonderful.' *(push hands up twice.)* Psalm 139:14 *(open hands like a book).*

Activity Name: Feed the Baby Birds

What You Need: ☐ Clothespins ☐ Cotton balls ☐ Bird printout

What You Say:

Come be little birdies with me! Tweet, tweet! Our Bible Story says God takes care of all the birds. He makes sure they have food. The baby birds in our nest are hungry! Let's help feed them!

What You Do:

- Scatter the cotton ball "food" on the floor around your area.
- Place the baby bird nest picture near the center of your group or room.
- Give each kid a clothespin. Demonstrate how to pinch it open and closed.
- Encourage children to pretend to be birds, using the clothespin as their beak.
- Ask children to find "food" and pick it up with their clothespin.
- Then bring the food back to the nest to feed the baby birds inside.
- Repeat as time and interest allow.

If clothespins are too difficult for some children, allow them to use their fingers to pick up the cotton balls.

Tweet, tweet! Thank you, little birds! You fed all the babies! God takes care of the birds, and in today's Bible Story we learned that God takes care of YOU even more because you are so, so important to Him! God made you amazing and wonderful! Who made you wonderful? *[Bottom Line]* God made me wonderful!
