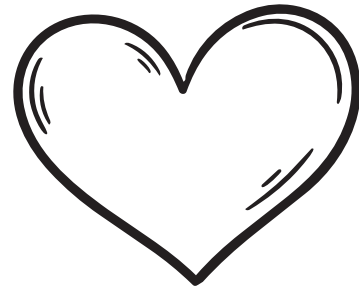

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Sheep Fun Facts

Sheep can rotate their ears nearly 180 degrees, and each ear can move independently to detect sounds from different directions.

Sheep can hear higher-pitched sounds than humans, helping them detect subtle noises like predators and distant calls.

Ewes (mother sheep) and lambs can recognize each other's voices even in a noisy flock.

Sheep are very sensitive to sudden or loud sounds, which helps them stay alert and safe.

The position of a sheep's ears can show how it is feeling: forward means curious, sideways means relaxed, and back can mean nervous.
